Resolution Suspending the Living Wage Requirements for the East

Bay Zoological Society Until July 1, 2005

## **Background**

At its April 5, 2005, meeting, the City Council passed a motion to suspend the application of the Living Wage Ordinance to the East Bay Zoological Society until July 1, 2005. The City Attorney's Office advised that a resolution incorporating findings was necessary.

Under Oakland Municipal Code section 2.28.080 (B), the City Council may grant a waiver only "upon a finding and determination that the [recipient of City financial assistance] has demonstrated economic hardship and that waiver will further the interests of the city in providing training positions which will enable employees to advance into permanent living wage jobs or better. No waiver will be granted if the effect of the waiver is to replace or displace existing positions or employees or to lower the wages of current employees."
