211	Robbery—confronting a person and demanding money or property by force or fear of force. Individual or commercial, armed or strong-armed.
212.5	Residential Robbery—breaking into a home to confront the residents for money or property.

247	Shoot at Uninhabited Dwelling or Vehicle
459	Burglary—breaking into an empty structure (house, car, store, etc.) for the purpose of stealing.

Statutes beginning with PC are from the Penal Code.

Statutes beginning with HS are from the Health and Safety Code and are usually the drug offenses of sale, possession, possession for sale, and under the influence.

Statutes beginning with VC are from the Vehicle Code and are primarily stolen autos. Other offenses from the Vehicle Code are drunk driving, getting towed for illegal parking or vehicle abandonment, or other offenses related to driving.
