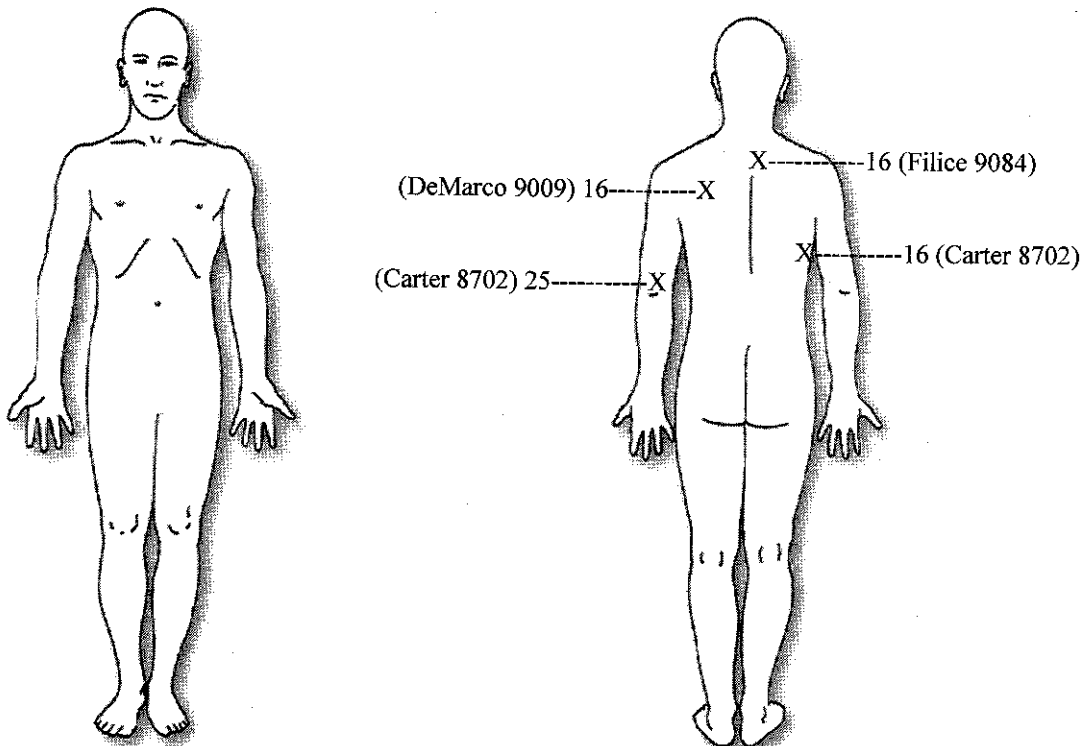

VI. NOTIFICATIONS

The officers notified Sgt. B. Wehrly of the use of force at 0104 hrs. I notified the Watch Commander, Lt. D. Hoppenhauer, at approximately 0212 hrs. The incident was placed on the Daily Use of Force log at Communications. I sent the face sheet to IAD, BFO Admin, DC Rachal, and Capt. Downing on 21 Sep 12, around 0956 hrs.

VII. DESCRIPTION OF INCIDENT SCENE

The incident occurred in a mainly commercial district, on the west sidewalk. It was dark but the area was fairly well lit with standard city street lights; visibility was good. The weather was cool and dry. Telegraph is a wide street, with two lanes of traffic in each direction. Although the area has some residential units, it is mainly a commercial district. The city blocks are large.

VIII. SUMMARY OF INCIDENT

Ofc. Carter and Ofc. DeMarco (3A8) were dispatched to 24<sup>th</sup> St. and Telegraph Ave. (to the Stork Club at 2330 Telegraph) on a report of domestic violence. The victim, [REDACTED] advised the suspect (Subject #1 [REDACTED]) had hit her on the mouth. Ofc. Filice (3L12) responded to assist. On scene, Carter and DeMarco noticed [REDACTED] had a swollen right cheek and upper lip; she also had a bruise on her upper left bicep. [REDACTED] advised her fiancé, [REDACTED] had hit her with a fist in her face. Filice began to search the area for the suspect. As [REDACTED] was talking to Carter, she noticed [REDACTED] walking northbound across the street, on the west sidewalk, north of [REDACTED] location (in the 2400 block of Telegraph, approximately 350-400 feet away). [REDACTED] wanted her fiancé arrested and advised of his location.

Carter got into his patrol car and drove to [REDACTED] location, while DeMarco spoke with [REDACTED] further. Carter pulled up to the curb and activated his emergency lights. He got out of the car and told [REDACTED] to stop walking and get to his knees. [REDACTED] made eye contact with Carter and then fled on foot, southbound Telegraph. Carter followed, ordering [REDACTED] to stop. [REDACTED] ran approximately ten feet when Carter, with his left hand, was able to grab [REDACTED]' left wrist. At the same time, Carter, with his other (right) hand, grabbed [REDACTED] left arm above the elbow. [REDACTED] tensed his arm muscles and lowered his center of gravity. Carter attempted to move [REDACTED]' left arm behind his back. [REDACTED] stopped Carter by keeping his arm straight and trying to pull away. Carter attempted to perform an arm bar take-down. [REDACTED] initially didn't move, but then turned his body in the direction Carter was trying to force him into. [REDACTED] finally dropped to his knees on his own. Carter continued to try to force [REDACTED] to the ground, but [REDACTED] resisted by tensing his arm muscles. Carter moved behind [REDACTED] and used his body weight against [REDACTED]' back to force him to the ground. At this point, DeMarco arrived at Carter's location to assist. Filice arrived after DeMarco.

[REDACTED] lay on his stomach, on the ground, with his arms in front and under his body by his waistband. Carter ordered [REDACTED] several times to stop resisting and to give him (Carter) his hands. [REDACTED] did not comply. Carter tried to pull [REDACTED]' right arm from underneath his body, but [REDACTED] kept his muscles tense. DeMarco and Filice tried to pull [REDACTED]' left arm from underneath his body at the same time; [REDACTED] kept himself rigid and did not move. Due to the nature of the call and the officers' knowledge and experience, they thought [REDACTED] with his hands hidden and near his waistband, was an immediate threat and could possibly have a weapon in his waistband. Carter told [REDACTED] several

times to comply or he would be struck. [REDACTED] did not comply and continued to tense his muscles. Carter struck [REDACTED] lower right rib cage area two times with a right-handed hammer fist. DeMarco, using his left hand, struck two quick hammer fist strikes to [REDACTED] left shoulder blade area. Filice struck [REDACTED] upper back area once with a right-handed hammer fist. The officers intended to distract [REDACTED] so [REDACTED] would relax his muscles enough for the officers to gain control of his arms. At the same time, Carter continued to issue orders to [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] relaxed his muscles. Carter moved off of [REDACTED] and pulled [REDACTED] right arm from underneath his body. DeMarco and Filice pulled [REDACTED] left arm from underneath Thomas' body. [REDACTED] was handcuffed without further incident.

Filice searched [REDACTED] incident to arrest and placed him in a patrol car. [REDACTED] was served with a Temporary Restraining Order and later transported to North County Jail (by Filice). [REDACTED] was arrested for Corporal Injury to Spouse (273.5 PC), Criminal Threats (422 PC), and Resisting a Peace Officer (148(a) PC).

IX. INVESTIGATION

Sgt. Wehrly, 3X72, arrived on scene and conducted the investigation. He separated the officers prior to interviewing them. He also interviewed [REDACTED]. I arrived after Sgt. Wehrly and Officers Young and Anderson were directed to assist with a canvass for witnesses.

Sgt. Wehrly interviewed [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] said he had been walking down the street by himself when the officer (Carter) contacted him. [REDACTED] advised, "The cat pulled me over, said woo woo woo. I said, man, I didn't know what the hell he was talking about. So I walked off." [REDACTED] admitted he was told to "come here," but he "resisted." When asked how he had resisted, [REDACTED] indicated he kept walking. He was then taken to the ground "by force." He felt a knee on his back and neck. [REDACTED] wouldn't provide any further information.

I reviewed Carter's PDRD recording. The recording showed Carter approaching [REDACTED] (who was standing/walking on the sidewalk) and ordering him to get on his knees (twice). [REDACTED] did not get on his knees. At that point, it appears that Carter began to run and/or move quickly and the recording abruptly ended. Carter advised he had turned on his PDRD and later, after [REDACTED] was in custody, he discovered the PDRD had fallen off and was underneath [REDACTED] during the incident. It appeared the PDRD inadvertently turned off at the point when Carter engaged in his physical struggle with [REDACTED].

I reviewed the audio recording of the radio traffic/transmissions at the time of incident. [REDACTED] could be heard saying, "What I'd do? What I'd do?" Carter could then be heard saying, "Put your arms behind your back! Stop!" Shortly thereafter, DeMarco indicated [REDACTED] was in custody. The recording showed Carter did in fact give [REDACTED] commands to put his arms behind his back and to stop (resisting).

X. CIVILIAN WITNESS STATEMENT(S) / CANVASS

Young conducted a canvass of the 2400 block of Telegraph Ave (which consisted mainly of closed businesses). He also canvassed 2404 Telegraph Ave where he interviewed Witness #2 [REDACTED] (statement summarized below). Young also searched for surveillance cameras in the area and did not locate any cameras that recorded the incident.

Witness #1 [REDACTED] was the manager at the Stork Club on the night of the incident. [REDACTED] said he and his security guard, [REDACTED], had thrown [REDACTED] out of the club. When officers arrived on scene, [REDACTED] advised [REDACTED] was up the street (about two hundred and fifty feet away). One officer (a male white) got into his patrol car and went to [REDACTED] location. [REDACTED] ran away from the officer (back towards the club). The officer chased after [REDACTED] and grabbed him. The two fell to the ground. [REDACTED] was at the corner of the building, sideways against the wall. The officer was in front of [REDACTED], on the ground with [REDACTED] with his knees on [REDACTED] back. The officer tried to hold [REDACTED] down and get [REDACTED] hands behind his back. The officer told [REDACTED] to put his hands behind his back.

[REDACTED] resisted by trying to get up and/or run. The officer yelled something to [REDACTED] during this incident (but [REDACTED] couldn't determine if the officer was asking for help or giving commands to [REDACTED]). [REDACTED] told the second officer (a male black) that his partner needed help. The officer went to [REDACTED] location and handcuffed [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] did not see any officer hit or kick [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] only remembered two officers with [REDACTED].

Security guard [REDACTED] went back into the club when the officers left to contact [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] did not see the detention or any use of force.

Witness #2 [REDACTED] lived in the area and heard someone yelling outside, "Get on the ground!" [REDACTED] looked out of his apartment window and saw [REDACTED] lying on his stomach, on the ground. An officer had his knees on [REDACTED] back, trying to secure [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] struggled by moving his body back and forth, trying to shake the officer off. The officer told [REDACTED] to stop fighting (or something similar). At that time, an unknown white male citizen, wearing a white t-shirt, ran up to [REDACTED] and possibly held [REDACTED] head against the ground. [REDACTED] thought the unknown man was trying to help the police. The unknown man suddenly left in an unknown direction. The second officer arrived and held [REDACTED] head down. At some point, [REDACTED] was handcuffed but [REDACTED] was not sure when. The officers stood [REDACTED] up, pushed him against a police car and searched him. At the same time more police cars and a fire truck arrived on scene. No one had hit [REDACTED].

XI. SUMMARY OF EVIDENCE

OPD Evidence Technician A. Basurto (3C62) arrived on scene and took photos of Carter, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED].

I attached CDs containing a copy of Carter's PDRD recording and the audio of the radio transmissions for this incident to the use of force packet.

XII. INJURIES / MEDICAL CARE OR TREATMENT PROVIDED

Carter received a minor abrasion to the back of his right hand, on his middle right knuckle (between the phalanges and metacarpal bones). He received first aid from PMP 2169.

[REDACTED] was not injured; no medical necessary. No other officers were injured.

XIII. DISCREPANCIES

[REDACTED] said he felt a knee on his back and neck during the incident. [REDACTED] said the initial contacting officer (Carter) had put his knees on [REDACTED] back. [REDACTED] said an officer had his knees on [REDACTED] back, trying to secure [REDACTED]. Carter advised he had used his body weight against [REDACTED] back, to force [REDACTED] to the ground (from the kneeling position). Carter was not able to move off of [REDACTED] until [REDACTED] relaxed and allowed the officers to handcuff him. It was reasonable to believe Carter's weight (legs/body), while struggling with [REDACTED], was on [REDACTED] back and/or close to [REDACTED] neck. Additionally, Filice's hammer fist strike was in the upper center portion of [REDACTED] back while DeMarco's strikes were on [REDACTED] left shoulder blade area. [REDACTED] could have mistaken the officers' strikes as a knee on his back and neck. [REDACTED] perception appeared to corroborate the witnesses' and officers' accounts.

Witness [REDACTED] initially described the first officer to contact [REDACTED] as white and the second officer as black. Carter (an African American) and DeMarco (a Caucasian) were partners on the night of the incident. [REDACTED] later clarified he wasn't really sure of the race of either officer. Based upon this information, it was reasonable to believe [REDACTED] merely switched the officers' race when describing the incident.

I attempted to contact Victim [REDACTED] to determine if she had any information about [REDACTED] detention, but her phone number was not in service (and she lived in Fairfield).

**XIV. ANALYSIS OF USE OF FORCE**

Based on the above, the use of force was determined to be within policy due to the following:

- The officers were investigating a felony domestic violence incident.
- The victim was in a dating relationship with [REDACTED] and had visible injuries to her face and arm.
- The victim wanted [REDACTED] arrested.
- The victim pointed out [REDACTED] to the officers.
- The detention and arrest were legal.
- Carter ordered [REDACTED] to stop. [REDACTED], even by his own account, ignored Carter and did not comply with his verbal commands to stop.
- When Carter grabbed [REDACTED] to handcuff him, [REDACTED] resisted by tensing his muscles (preventing being handcuffed).
- Carter then attempted to use an arm-bar to force [REDACTED] to the ground, to prevent him from getting away.
- [REDACTED] continued to resist by continuing to tense his muscles and move his body around to counteract the arm-bar.
- Carter used his body weight to force [REDACTED] to the ground.
- Once on the ground, [REDACTED] moved his hands and arms underneath his body and moved his body around.
- [REDACTED] refused orders to put his hands behind his back.
- Each officer used one to two hammer fist strikes on [REDACTED] back to distract [REDACTED] from his own actions.
- [REDACTED] immediately relaxed his muscles.
- The officers stopped striking [REDACTED] and moved his arms behind his back.
- [REDACTED] was handcuffed without further uses of force.

**XV. TRAINING POINT(S)**

Neither DeMarco nor Filice activated their PDRD's during their contact with [REDACTED]. Both officers rushed to Carter's aid, focusing on getting to Carter's location and assisting him as he fought with [REDACTED]. Neither officer had forgotten to turn on their PDRD's in the past. Due to these circumstances, I counseled the officers about the importance of activating their PDRD's; the discussion was documented in an SNF.

Carter knew he was going to contact and arrest a domestic violence suspect. Carter decided to contact and arrest [REDACTED] on his own, without a cover unit or advising Dispatch of the stop. Carter should have at least advised Dispatch of the stop, thereby alerting Filice (or another officer) to provide immediate cover. As Carter left to detain [REDACTED], DeMarco stayed with the victim (knowing Carter was going to contact the suspect). As Carter's partner, DeMarco should have either gone with Carter to stop [REDACTED] or assisted with getting another unit to respond as a cover unit.

DeMarco and I discussed the issue; I documented the training in an SNF. I will provide training for Carter and document it in an SNF entry when he returns from vacation (2 Nov 12).
