Good morning,

The Oakland Police Department responded to a few dozen protestors this morning in the seaport area. Three arrests were made of individuals who were blocking the labor entrances. A few members of the ILWU union are refusing to enter the terminal due to a perceived health and safety issue because of the presence of law enforcement safeguarding the terminals. Only a few protestors remain.

Unfortunately, the labor order to work the ZIM vessel was not filled by ILWU this morning. The ZIM vessel will remain alongside the berth until the terminal operator determines if labor can be ordered and filled for this evening.

We will continue to monitor social media platforms to see if there are additional calls for protests such as we saw last night.
