After a couple of hours on the plane, you've arrived in Vegas ready to party. Don't make your trip to the hotel longer or more expensive. When you get in the taxi, tell the driver you want to be taken to your hotel via Paradise Road or Swenson Avenue, NOT the airport tunnel. The airport tunnel may seem faster because it connects to the freeway and has fewer lights, but the route is several miles longer resulting in cab fares that are \$5 to \$10 more.

Below are some average fares for taxis from Terminal 1 at McCarran International Airport compiled by the Nevada Taxi Cab Authority. There is an additional \$2 fee on all taxi fares that originate at the airport. Fares for taxis leaving from from Terminal 3 average about \$2 more than the fees listed below. Fees can vary based on traffic, time of year and more. A taxi driver can only charge a passenger what is displayed on the taxi's meter plus any credit card fees. If you ever have a concern about taxi service in Vegas you can contact the authority at 702-668-4005. You'll need that taxi company name, taxi number and driver's name, plus the date and time the problem occurred. You can also file a complaint online.
