Dear Greg Minor,

I am writing this letter to recommend the closure of Bella Ultra Lounge. I live at the condominium complex nearby at and I have been on the board of the Old Oakland Neighbors for two years. These are the reasons I feel the club should be closed:

- * As you may know, there has been a major escalation of violent events associated with club patrons in the past year culminating in a recent murder by gunfire. This is just the most recent of a long series of events and we feel that enough is enough.
- * The club does not follow the rules restricting flyering and we have found flyers littering the ground for multiple days a week and for nearly all weeks throughout the year. This is just one of the many activities that the club engages in that aren't permitted by current regulations. I feel these violations taken together should be enough to have the club closed down.
- * One anecdote pertaining to how the club impacts the neighborhood is as follows: A friend and I were eating at nearby El Gusano restaurant, and the thuggish appearance and actions/words of the patrons loitering outside of the club made my dinner companion uncomfortable and not want return to the restaurant. Thus nearby businesses pay the penalty for the faults of the club.
- * We have lived in the neighborhood for 6 years, and the first 3 years felt perfectly safe. Then more clubs and businesses moved in and this attracted crime because patrons became targets. However Bella Ultra Lounge compounds the problem because the type of patrons it attracts seem to have a higher propensity for criminal activity. Previously we lived across the street at on an upper floor facing ninth street. At that time Bella was called Arsimona (we have heard that the ownership is the same) and by the fourth year the club began to attract a great many more patrons who would cause problems. The street noise nightly grew to a very high level and I had a terrible time trying to sleep. This culminated in several side shows. I was terrified cars would hit our building and hit people in the street. Often I was up until 3 or 4 in the morning completely anxious often resulting in me getting no sleep for the night. This was the main motivation for me to move across the street to an interior facing unit.
- * We are lucky we currently live in a unit facing our interior courtyard and therefore avoid the noise that the club patrons generate late at night. However with the escalation of gun related incidents we are extremely worried that bullets may hit our unit as they have hit two other units. We are friends of the owner of one of the units, and her tenant moved out within a few days of the unit being shot into since the tenant became terrified of this neighborhood.

We have heard that the club is potentially not even operating with the required permits, and thus we hope that quick action can be taken to enforce the law and shut it down.


Shut Down Bella Ultra Lounge

Dear Mr. Minor:

I live at the Club Clark in the Old Oakland neighborhood. This building is less than 2 blocks away from Bella Ultra. For as long as I can remember, I have put up with the late night disturbances coming from nightclub patrons in our neighborhood. This noise has come primarily as people are arriving at the club (Bella Ultra Lounge) and blasting music, and between 1:15am and 2:30am, as people are leaving the club. The noise is from people getting drunk in their cars before they enter the club, and from when they continue to party (with music from car radios and yelling and screaming) after the club closes. I also have a front row seat to the fights that break out in the street, hear glass bottles and windows being broken routinely, and put up with revving engines. Our streets are left trashy many mornings, and strewn with broken bottles, promotional postcards, junk food wrappers and containers, vomit, urine, and feces.

I was angered and saddened to learn that the reckless behavior has recently escalated to shootings and homicide. Recently, some of our residents witnessed the fights leading up to the homicide on 10/1/14, and the immediate aftermath as well. This is distressing, and I will not feel safer until Bella Ultra Lounge and the activity that it is bringing to our neighborhood is closed down. I therefore support the Old Oakland Neighborhood (OON) NCPC's call to permanently revoke the cabaret license of Bella Ultra Lounge which has proven, over a long period of time, unable to de-escalate their patrons' behavior both inside and outside the club. The owners have ignored many core conditions to their permit so I cannot trust them to adhere to even more conditions on their operations. OON and our building have made many documented attempts to work with the owners of Bella to improve operations, without success. For the safety of this neighborhood, I urge you to exercise the authority of your office to shut the club down permanently with all haste, before another shooting takes another life in this neighborhood.


Dear Mr. Minor:

I own and live in a condo in the Market Square building in the Old Oakland neighborhood. This building is 2 blocks away from the Bella Ultra Lounge.

My unit is at the corner of 8th St and Clay St and I am regularly annoyed, disturbed and woken up by the loud noises late at night (midnight through about 2 AM) from nightclub patrons in our neighborhood. The noise takes various forms – loud arguments and threatening conversations, revving motorcycles and cars, and extremely loud music. I also regularly hear loud fights accompanied by screams and yells, to the point where every backfire sounds like a gunshot. There is also a ton of leftover trash in the streets from the partying. I often walk past drunk and belligerent club patrons as I am out walking my dog around 11 PM through midnight.

Then a few days back, I was angered, saddened and frankly scared to learn of the recent homicide two blocks from my place, outside the Bella Ultra Lounge. I do not think I can feel truly safe in this neighborhood unless Bella Ultra Lounge and the associated uncivil and criminal behavior it brings to the Old Oakland neighborhood is closed down.

Hence, I support the Old Oakland Neighborhood (OON) NCPC's call to permanently revoke the cabaret license of Bella Ultra Lounge. For the safety of this neighborhood, I urge you to exercise the authority of your office to shut the club down permanently with all haste, before another shooting takes another life in this neighborhood.

Hi Greg, Jennifer and Eli,

I wanted to share my thoughts on the Bella Ultra lounge. As a nearby resident, my condo overlooks the back parking lot of the Bella Ultra lounge. There is always commotion including loud music and side shows in the parking lot as the club closes for the night. I frequently walk my dogs late at night before I go to bed and know especially on the weekends to 'hurry up' and walk the dogs before 2am to avoid any drama. I actually fear for my safety when I see cars flying down the street screaming profanities.

On Tuesday when the murder occurred I was in bed trying to sleep. The weather was nice so I left my windows opened as I do most nights. I heard some arguing mostly in a female voice and I had a feeling something terrible was going to happen. After a few minutes of arguing, I heard a gunshot! My heart dropped and I knew it was bad because the female's voice got even louder in panic. I jumped to the window and to my surprise there was a cop already on the scene within seconds. I sat in my window to see about 7 more cops surrounding the blocks around the club, while the sirens flashed in my dark room. I sat in the window until about 3am watching nothing by police lights.. not a fun experience.

This was not the first time I've heard gun shots in the middle of the night. The craziest experience was when I heard about 10 shots from a machine gun! Not knowing where it was coming from, all I could do was hope it wasn't coming in my direction. I know I live in a large urban city and I LOVE it here but I hate the CRIME! I picked to live in Old Oakland because of all the cute restaurants, shops and friendly neighbors. If I don't even feel safe walking to a nearby great bar like Parliament because I have to walk by Bella Ultra lounge that is not right. It's not fair to the other wonderful bars and businesses nearby, or anyone living in this neighborhood! Please close down Bella Ultra lounge we do not need this drama in our beautiful Old Oakland neighborhood!

Dear Mr. Minor,

I am the owner-occupant a 4th floor condominium unit at apparatument faces 10th Street directly across from two ground level parking lots presenting a wide open area from 11th Street to the wall of my building. These lots are a short distance west on 11th Street from the Bella Ultra Lounge at the corner of Clay Street.


On Wednesday, July 23, 2014 I awoke to find the frame of the right side bay window in my living room torn apart (right bottom quadrant) and the outer glass pane shattered. Debris of the smashed frame covered the window sill and floor and what appeared to be a spent bullet sat on the window sill.


I reported the above by phone on 7/23/14 to the Oakland Police Department and later that afternoon two police officers responded, inspected the damage, took a photo, confirmed the presence of a spent bullet (which they collected as evidence) and advised me on how to obtain a copy of the Incident Report. That Incident Report is Number 14-037089 and I can provide you with a copy if you wish. I was also visited that same day by the occupant of Unit 317 (apartment directly below mine), who told me that a shot came through the living room wall of that unit sometime during the early morning hours of 7/23/14 and that she reported that to the police who then recovered a spent bullet from that unit also. While I am still in the process of obtaining repair estimates for the damage to my Unit, I believe the minimum costs of replacing the frame and window will reach \$500 or more.

On 7/24/14 an email (to our building's Yahoo! group), related that a member of our condominium's Board of Directors heard 6 or 7 gunshots fired at 1:40a.m. on 7/23/14 from the direction of 11th Street and immediately phoned in a report of the gunshot sounds to the Oakland Police Department where documentation of that emergency call should be available. While I don't claim expertise in gunshot trajectories, a common sense inspection of the bullet's entry point suggests an origin in the reported gunfire sounds from 11th Street. Stray bullets in a confused melee of some fight on 11th. street would have a clear path across the open parking lots to my window frame and this would be even more true for the bullet which entered the mid point of the wall of Unit (on 3rd. floor directly below my apartment). The entry point of the bullet was only 1 foot from the wall (4 feet from the window) of the bedroom where I was asleep at the reported time of the gunshot sounds.

There have been 13 known shooting incidents in our Old Oakland Neighborhood since March, 2013 including two homicides at least one of which (Oct.1,2014), is apparently linked to a fight originating at the Bella Ultra Lounge. At least several of the disturbances and shootings appear to have occurred at or near closing time of the BUL cabaret located upstairs at the corner of 11th and Clay streets. I believe that it was just such an altercation which resulted in gunshots damaging my apartment and potentially placing me in danger.

Given my personal experience and losses as documented above and the long history of neighborhood disturbances resulting from the operations of Bella Ultra Lounge as a cabaret, I respectfully request that the present cabaret permit for this business be permanently revoked. I also request that, unless it is legally mandatory that my personal identification be made public, that my name and residence Unit # be redacted from the public record.


Dear Mr. Minor,

I have been a resident of Oakland since 1977 and a resident in the Old Town Square building in the Old Oakland neighborhood for five years. I am distressed about the recent crimes and significant disturbances in our community. As a senior, I have felt comfortable walking alone at night and would like to continue to feel safe in my neighborhood. That may not be possible until some action is taken to get the nightclubs under control, particularly the Bella Ultra Lounge which has created serious problems.

I know that other residents have written about the noise, fights, shootings, and homicide resulting from club activities that have not been controlled by the club. I would like to voice additional concerns. Oakland has long had a poor reputation, which has been improving. When we have bullets coming into living room windows and murders down the street, the reputation of Oakland is damaged. We will not be able to attract businesses, builders, or residents. Our property values, which have finally come up from down under, will fall. People will move away and our neighborhood will deteriorate.

All of this is very bad for our city and our community. Old Oakland is a wonderful place to live. Oakland is a fabulous city, often maligned. Let us not live up to the reputation of Oakland as a place of crime and death. We need to reach our goal of attracting businesses and residents and continue to improve our living conditions.

To that end, I support the Old Oakland Neighborhood's (OON) NCPC's call to revoke the city cabaret license of Bella Ultra Lounge which is creating an extremely unsafe and untenable situation. For the safety of the community and the reputation and well being of our city, I cannot urge you strongly enough to exercise the authority of your office to shut this club down permanently and immediately before another life is taken in our neighborhood.

Dear Mr. Minor,

I am writing to you because my elderly mother lives at the Country of the street class and being woken up at 2:00 A.M. when the nearby club (Bella Ultra Lounge) closes. She talks about how the bar patrons are yelling, playing very loud music, revving up their cars and being rowdy. She comments that the club patrons sound like they are drunk. She also has long complained that each morning the previously clean sidewalks and gutters near the club and all around the block, including along her street, are littered with trash, bottles, paper, vomit and other body fluids littered by the club goers. She complains this makes her neighborhood look trashy and less valuable and negates the work of the street cleaners. Now she is talking about the escalating gun violence which has become commonplace, and listening to gunshots being fired. Most recently, the neighbor down the hall from her unit recently had gunshots fired through his window and land in his living room! Fortunately he was not hit. It will cost the neighbor thousands of dollars to repair his window and it is really frightening to think that gunshots could be fired into my mother's living room or bedroom. This is completely unacceptable! I am very afraid for my mother's safety. She often sits in her living room by the window or is in her bedroom, both of which face the street and are susceptible to these lawless gunshots.

My mother has long been an Oakland booster, telling friends that Oakland is a safe and good place to live, especially downtown. She enjoys living in Old Oakland and has lived there fourteen years. But this escalating noise, public disturbance, trash, fighting, and now gunshots bring frightening violence and a bad element to Old Oakland where it was previously a very quiet and safe neighborhood.

Please close the Bella Ultra Lounge. It brings unsightly extra trash (and worse), loud nighttime noise, rowdiness, public nuisance and now, most worrisome, demonstrated gun violence. It reinforces the negative image of Oakland and now is bringing real violence and fear into this previously quiet, safe and well-regarded neighborhood. No good comes from having this club in the neighborhood. I fear for my mother's safety. I respectfully ask that you close down Bella Ultra Lounge.

Dear Mr. Minor:

I live in the Bridgeport Community in the Old Oakland neighborhood facing 9th Street. My family moved to Old Oakland two years ago from out of state. My husband and I live here with our two young children and, because of our children's safety, I'd like our names to remain confidential.

Since we've moved to the neighborhood, we have experienced several minor disturbances (our bike was stolen and our car window has been smashed in twice). We brushed off these incidents as annoyances that made us feel vulnerable, but were also things that can be expected to happen if you live in Oakland, no matter what part of town. However, this last year, as gun violence has escalated, we feel frightened to live here. We have two more years on our lease and are not able to move away because of our financial status. Knowing there is shrapnel lodged in our building's walls and that a loaded weapon could have just as easily been dropped into our front gate instead of the one just a few gates down is truly terrifying.

My husband often works late at night and has to walk home through this neighborhood from the 12th Street BART station to 9th Street and I feel nervous about his walk every night. Every night of the week we are kept up by the sounds of drunken yelling, fighting, and car engine revving and stereo blasting between the hours of 11pm and 2:30 am. Our bedroom windows look out onto the street where many club patrons park. One recent night, we endured an escalating angry fight right outside and we were afraid to be so close to the giant glass windows right beside our bed. The string of gun violence crosses the line. Now we are not talking about an annoyance that comes with living in a downtown neighborhood. This has become an epidemic danger that will keep this wonderful neighborhood from thriving.

We can avoid going outside very late at night, sure, but we will inadvertently suffer in other ways, too. If wonderful businesses and restaurants decide this part of town is too crime-ridden and dangerous a place to be, than the many wonderful benefits of living here (its walkability, its culture, its one-of-a-kind shops and restaurants) will dwindle, too.

I love living here, but I don't want to be afraid to live here, and I am. Now, as I walk the lovely neighborhood streets, lined with trees, container gardens, and restaurants like Le Cheval and El Gustano on my way to the post office, I know that I step over the spot where a man was shot and killed, a spot recently puddled with a man's blood.

We therefore support the Old Oakland Neighborhood (OON) NCPC's call to permanently revoke the cabaret license of Bella Ultra Lounge which has proven, over a long period of time, to be unable to deescalate their patrons' behavior both inside and outside the club. The owners have ignored many core conditions to their permit so we cannot trust them to adhere to even more conditions on their operations. OON and our building have made many documented attempts to work with the owners of Bella to improve operations, without success. For the safety of this neighborhood, we urge you to exercise the authority of your office to shut the club down permanently with all haste, before another shooting takes another life in this neighborhood.

I am writing to urge you to permanently revoke Ultra Bella Lounge's cabaret permit. I am an owner resident at Old Town Square, with my unit on the second floor facing the street. I have lived at Old Town Square since day 1, and have generally been thrilled to see more businesses open nearby. But Ultra Bella Lounge - just like the previous club Arsimona - has caused nothing but trouble, and now makes me literally fear for my life and that of my visitors. When I tell friends where live, I get worried looks and questions about "all the shootings in that neighborhood." My boy-friend no ;longer wants to spend nights at my place because there is routinely so much noise on weekend nights that it's impossible to sleep, and now you even have to worry that another few stray bullets will actually hit you in your sleep! It's been sheer luck that nobody was injured when stray bullets hit some of our units recently. Another problem is the litter Ultra Bella Lounge's patrons leave behind. I have adopted the storm drains on Clay Street @ 9th Street to keep litter from going down the storm drains and into our creeks, but it's discouraging to do this when I see loads of wrappers, cigarette butts, alcohol bottles, disposable cups and other trash left behind every weekend. I am quite concerned about my condo's value as well, as fewer people want to buy in an area where you can't sleep and won't be safe at night. I am all in favor of supporting local businesses, including clubs, but they need to add to the quality of life in *my* neighborhood, not detract from it. Their patrons don't live here. They bring their problems and then leave it up to us local residents to deal with the fallout. Not right!! The only solution I can see is to revoke their cabaret license and I urge to to support Old Oakland neighbors in our effort to achieve this and help locals feel safe again.



Dear Mr. Ferran, Mr. Minor and Officer Sena:

We live in the Old Town Square building in the Old Oakland neighborhood. Since the time that we moved in to the building about nine years ago, we have encountered continual late night disturbances coming from nightclub patrons in our neighborhood. This noise has come primarily as people are arriving at the club (Bella Ultra Lounge) and blasting music, and between 1:15am and 2:30am, as people are leaving the club. The noise is from people getting drunk in their cars before they enter the club, and from when they continue to party (with music from car radios and yelling and screaming) after the club closes.

Residents in the buildling also have a front row seat to the fights that break out in the street, hear glass bottles and windows being broken routinely, and put up with revving engines. Our streets are left trashy many mornings, and strewn with broken bottles, promotional postcards, junk food wrappers and containers, vomit, urine, and feces. We were saddened to learn that the reckless behavior has recently escalated to shootings and homicide. Recently, our building has been hit by stray bullets from the parking lot behind Bella Ultra Lounge, and some of our residents witnessed the fights leading up to the homicide on 10/1/14, and the immediate aftermath as well. This is distressing, and we will not feel safer until Bella Ultra Lounge and the activity that it is bringing to our neighborhood is closed down.

We also do not feel safe going out at night regardless of whether we drive home or walk home from BART. We choose to live in downtown Oakland for its vibrance, diversity and convenience. The ongoing safety issue in the neighborhood however dampens the desire to go out at night and at times raises questions as to whether the neighborhood is desirable for residence. This is of course not helpful for other Oakland business (e.g. restaurants which do not have patron behavior issues) and harm Oakland's reputation and economy.

We therefore support the Old Oakland Neighborhood (OON) NCPC's call to permanently revoke the cabaret license of Bella Ultra Lounge which has proven, over a long period of time, to be unable to de-escalate their patrons' behavior both inside and outside the club. The owners have ignored many core conditions to their permit so we cannot trust them to adhere to even more conditions on their operations. OON and our building have made many documented attempts to work with the owners of Bella to improve operations, without success. For the safety of this neighborhood, we urge you to exercise the authority of your office to shut the club down permanently with all haste, before another shooting takes another life in this neighborhood.

For the six years I have lived here, there have been late night disturbances by nightclub patrons in our neighborhood, primarily on Thursday to Sunday nights. This noise is directly related to patrons of the Bella Ultra Lounge arriving and blasting music, then later, between 1:15am and 2:30am, as people are leaving the club. I have a front row seat to the fights that break out in the street, people yelling, glass bottles and windows being broken routinely, and revving engines and music from motorcycles and cars.

I am disappointed that the reckless behavior has recently escalated to shootings and homicide. Recently, our building has been hit by stray bullets from the parking lot behind Bella Ultra Lounge.

From my bedroom window, I could hear loud voices and fights leading up to the homicide on 10/1/14, and the immediate aftermath as well. Unfortunately, this was not the first incident.

This is distressing, and I will not feel safer until Bella Ultra Lounge and the activity that it is bringing to our neighborhood is closed down.

I therefore support the Old Oakland Neighborhood (OON) NCPC's call to permanently revoke the cabaret license of Bella Ultra Lounge which has proven, over a long period of time, to be unable to de-escalate their patrons' behavior both inside and outside the club. 
I live in the Old Town Square building in Old Oakland. I have lived here for 10 years. My wife has lived here for 12 years. We met here in this neighborhood, were married and had children here, and want to remain here in what has become a tight-knit and engaged community.

Arsimona moved into this neighborhood six years ago. They were friendly initially, and our neighborhood group made an effort to make them feel welcome here. They hosted community happy hours and neighborhood events. However, their late night activities also caused concern. Loud music could regularly be heard past midnight through their open windows. Their late-night guests were often unruly and disrespectful to the rights of neighbors to have peaceful and quiet enjoyment of their property. Some guests would hang out by their cars well after closing time, with car doors open, engines running, music blaring, yelling at people as they drove by. Occasionally, the loud voices would turn violent, and street fights would break out. This activity began to worry neighbors, and we began to lose our sense of safety in the neighborhood.

Unfortunately, these fights have recently escalated, and in the last 18 months, our neighborhood has experienced at least 13 shooting events. Gunshots and homicidal acts of violence should not be tolerated in any neighborhood, and we have witnessed a worrisome spike recently. The two most recent incidents (7/23/14 and 10/1/14) are tied directly to Bella's activities, the patrons that they attract (who may have prior beefs with each other from outside this neighborhood), and Bella security's lack of skill in de-escalating incidents inside the club, getting people safely to their cars, and on their way home at the end of the night.

As the violence has escalated, we have become more fearful. We used to contribute to neighborhood safety by taking our dog for walks at night. We would walk strangers to their cars, politely advise people against talking on their phones while walking on the street, and remind people getting out of their cars that they should not leave items visible. These were little things that we could do to help people stay safe, to enjoy our neighborhood businesses, and make our streets feel welcoming. Now, we find ourselves afraid to have conversations with strangers, we find ourselves disengaging, we find ourselves closing our windows to the street and moving our furniture against the walls in the hope that a stray bullet won't find its way through.

As neighbors, we can no longer stand by. We therefore support the Old Oakland Neighborhood (OON) NCPC's call to permanently revoke the cabaret license of Bella Ultra Lounge. The owners have ignored their conditions of approval, and have refused to improve their practices despite many complaints from neighbors, and now they have put lives in peril, with disastrous consequences. For the safety of this neighborhood, we urge you to exercise the authority of your office to shut down the club permanently with all haste, before another shooting takes another life in this neighborhood, before violence drains our neighborhood of its vitality and connectedness.

I was at the hearing on Bella Ultra Lounge today and thought some of the descriptions of geography were pretty confusing. Also, there were misrepresentations by the Bella Ultra witnesses on the existence of similar businesses in the neighborhood.

Attached is a crude map which I hope can be of some use in clearing things up. Someone else with better tools can make a much better map, but I think this gives the needed information.

All of the blue blocks are residential buildings. There are three red blocks. The largest of the three is Bella Ultra. The smallest is Liege and the mid-sized one is Parliament. The X's mark a more traditional bar, a pub, and a sausage and beer place. While there are some complaints around the neighborhood about Liege, I never hear anyone complain about the other places. And no business comes close to creating the volume of people on the sidewalks and streets that Bella Ultra does.

As several people pointed out today, the neighborhood is remarkably quiet now that Bella Ultra is shut. The chaos they routinely create has not been replaced by a similar output from the other places.



I am writing this letter to lend my voice to the request that Bella Ultra Lounge be shut down. I used to live at in the Old Town Square condo building. I moved away to another part of Oakland because I could not handle the noise, violence, litter, and other problems that stemmed from the business that is now called Bella. My family still owns the condo unit in Old Town Square and I still have a vested interest in the safety and wellbeing of the neighborhood of Old Oakland. We have tenants that live in #217 and I worry about them and my former neighbors. There are senior citizens and lots of families that live in our building, and I wonder how they are able to get any sleep on the weekends due to the craziness outside their windows.

While I lived in our condo, I was regularly and consistently awakened each Thursday, Friday, and Saturday nights by patrons of the "lounge" formerly known as Arsimona departing after it closed. There were fights, constant shouting, loud music, public urination, and littering. I called the police on numerous occasions about the problems with this business and its owners the Kiflits. I worked for several months in 2008 with Carletta Starks (Councilmember Nadel) and Barb Killey (City Adminstrator's Office) on the nuisance issues stemming from this business. We as a neighborhood tried very hard to first work with the business owners to get them to be a better neighbor, and when that did not work, we began documenting the police calls and problems with Barb Killey. Nothing changed. I would call the police to document the problems and get an incident report but nothing happened. Thus, from a historical perspective, the owners of the business who are apparently the owners of Bella Ultra Lounge, the Kiflit brothers, are entirely disinterested in being a good neighbor. I gave up and moved.

Old Oakland has several other nightclubs and bars that are open as late as Bella, but those owners are conscientious about trying to be a good neighbor and making sure that their patrons do not cause problems as they leave. Why should Bella be allowed to operate with a cabaret license if they are unwilling to do what the other club owners in the neighborhood already do? I heard from the first hearing last week, that a defense from Bella was that there are several other clubs in the area and how can the neighbors tell that the problems come from Bella and not those other clubs? I can tell you why. Because the residents of Old Oakland are awake at 2:15 a.m. on Saturday and Sunday mornings looking out their windows and can SEE that the people causing the problems are exiting Bella Lounge.

I moved because I could tell that this business was not going to be responsive to the complaints of the neighborhood and would never be a good neighbor because the owners did not care at all about the problems their business caused. I am appalled and angry that the City of Oakland has allowed a business to operate that causes so much trouble, generates so much trash that City workers or residents must pick up, and police calls that take police away from other duties, for so long. It is a very sad statement of fact that a human being had to die before the City considered any action. Bella should have been shut down years ago.

To Oakland City Hall, Oakland City Council, and anyone else to whom it concerns:

I submitted a letter on October 11th regarding Bella Ultra Lounge. I am submitting this letter as supplemental testimony regarding the neighborhood since Bella's cabaret permit has been revoked.

As I mentioned in my October 11th letter, the weekend before the shooting, I was awoken at about 1:45am to the sounds of a street party happening immediately outside my home, at 9th and Clay, two blocks from Bella. I watched for 30-40 minutes while people partied outside, until I finally gave up and went back to sleep. Car alarms were blaring, music was loud from cars, people were yelling back and forth, a young woman and man sat on the corner and shared a bottle while yelling at everyone who passed them. One man drove by and yelled out, "Where da hoes at?!" This is such a common occurrence on club nights, but still infuriates me every time, especially since the police are over capacity and do not have time to deal with the weekly club overflow.

I also wrote and testified that since Bella's cabaret permit was temporarily revoked, it was been quiet in the neighborhood. To add credence to my testimony, this past weekend, October 17-19, I closely monitored the neighborhood. Attached are my notes to myself throughout the weekend. My overall comment is that, while there was still some street noise from Liege Bar down the street about two blocks, it was an utterly different scene from what is normal when Bella is open. Neighbors can sleep when Bella is closed. No one can sleep when Bella is open.

I truly believe that Bella is a bad club that brings a bad element into the neighborhood. The patrons of the other local bars and restaurants do not disturb the peace like Bella's patrons do. I have not seen public urination by clubgoers in front of my home since Bella has been closed, which I saw regularly before its cabaret permit was temporarily revoked. The streets are not littered, the noise level does not wake up neighbors. There is a direct correlation between Bella's being open or closed and the nuisance level in the neighborhood on club nights.

Bella was opened on or about the same year that my building, Market Square, was opened. Market Square has 202 residential units two blocks from Bella. The testimony of the current owner's brother at the hearing on Friday, October 17th, made it clear that Bella has no interest in working with the neighborhood, and is not hearing our complaints for what they are - a request to be able to live in our homes without being disturbed every weekend, without having regular shootings in the neighborhood, without waking up each weekend morning to see the broken bottles, broken car windows, used condoms, discarded high heels, human defecation, and other garbage that shows up regularly when Bella is open, and was not to be seen this past weekend.

The reporting of the recent arrest of the October 1 murderer confirms that he had been in the club that night. Did he go back to his car for his gun, or just have it on him the whole evening while he was in the club?

All you need to do is read the business's Yelp reviews to see that many of its patrons also hold it in very low esteem.


9/24/14: These people knew they had no business squeezing all those damn people in that small lounge space and the owners seemed to take NO pride in their business. No one deserves to have their hard earned money wasted on this place.

8/13/14: There is so much wrong with this place on so many levels, I feel for the people working there. ... Given that it is dead most of the time during the week and "ghettoed" out during the weekend, some things definitely need to change.

4/12/14: I hate it. If I could give zero stars I would.

10/28/13: Awful place, awful service, untrained security, useless and unreasonable owner. This is just Arismona lounge disguising itself with a new name. Look up those ratings and see what this place is really like. Definitely the place to b on the weekend if u dont value your safety and like partying with ratchet people. Really ghetto and low class environment.

In closing, please consider strongly this neighborhood's outcry of support for the City to permanently revoke the cabaret license for Bella Ultra Lounge. This neighborhood has over 500 residential units within two blocks of Bella, many of which house small children and older retired persons. The club directly affects the noise, litter, and violence in the neighborhood, and is a significant nuisance. The rights of the neighborhood for peace and safety should be paramount in making this determination.


Dear Mr. Ferran, Ms. Sena, and Mr. Minor,

Attached is the settlement agreement we reached today with the operators of Bella Ultra Lounge. Apologies if it is difficult to read as I have attached the handwritten version; we will type up and circulate a cleaner version later on.

Essentially, rather than let the hearing officer render a decision short of revocation with no inclusion of a CPTED requirements we reached the following agreement:

-Bella's cabaret permit will remain suspended until Thursday November 13th -Bella has to pay for a CPTED that will be performed as soon as possible -The conditions outlined in the CPTED report will then be incorporated into the conditions attached to Bella's cabaret permit -City reserves the right to recover excessive police costs from October 1st murder upon occurrence of another violent event related to Bella -The hearing will be suspended for the next 120 days.

Although neighbors who were seeking complete revocation may be disappointed and there could be some resource issues in enforcing the CPTED conditions, overall I think this is a great chance to put specific measures in place that will reduce/eliminate the noise, nuisance and violence associated with Bella.

- 11. Video cameras covering parking lot 1 and sidewalks outside Bella to be installed.

- 13. Bella to hire downtown ambassador staff for each night of special event to monitor parking lot and adjacent blocks.
- 14.OPD to be notified as existing permit conditions require for any cabaret event.
- 15.DJ entertainment should be categorized as a cabaret event.
- 16. Limit live entertainment to once monthly per ABC conditions.
- 17. Bella owners to meet with NCPC and OPD prior to opening.
- 18. City and OPD to commit to an enforcement plan with identified resources to monitor all conditions and events to ensure safety of residents.
- 19. Owner of property to provide assurance they will immediately terminate lease if any violence associated with the property occurs.
- 20. Change permitted cabaret activity hours to 11am to 12:30am.

- 21. Bella Ultra shall, when in operation after 10:00 p.m., be responsible to provide security in the parking lot adjacent to its leased premises on 11th Street (APN 2-35-5-2). It shall also be responsible to maintain security in the parking lots abutting that lot and fronting on 10th Street (APN 2-35-9 and 2-35-11) if those lots are open during those hours. However, if an OPD officer went to check on the event while it was happening, s/he could verify if it is cabaret activity. Rather than shut the event down, it might just get filed for later evidence, in case Bella goes back to a hearing in the future.





Lt. Steinberger,

Happy Halloween! I hope your team had a safe night out on the streets. I wanted to alert you to this event that is scheduled for next week, 11/5, at Bella. They are selling tickets (see screen shots below). If Bella sells alcohol that evening, I think it qualifies as a cabaret event.

I have mixed feelings about this. On one hand, this is the type of event that I would love to go to and support. It's exactly the kind of programming that I hope is successful at Bella.

On the other hand, if it is a cabaret event (paid entrance plus alcohol), then it is a blatant violation of their suspension. Ofc. Sena advised us that if a neighborhood resident went and verified whether there was alcohol being served, that this would not hold up later in a public hearing. However, if an OPD officer went to check on the event while it was happening, s/he could verify if it is cabaret activity. Rather than shut the event down, it might just get filed for later evidence, in case Bella goes back to a hearing in the future.

Dear Property Owner(s):

The Oakland Police Department has provided our office evidence of nuisance activity at the above-referenced property and is requesting that the subject property be declared a public nuisance pursuant to Oakland Municipal Code (OMC) Chapter 1, Section 1.08 et seq. Having reviewed the evidence and good cause existing, the City declares the following:

- The nuisance activity including, but not limited to, loitering and disturbance of peace documented in the attachment(s), constitute a public nuisance. These activities constitute a threat to the health, safety, and well-being of the surrounding community and as such constitute a public nuisance. A public nuisance shall also exist whenever a condition on a property is corrected but recurs, and continues as a recurrent problem (OMC Section 1.08.030.B); and
- A review of the aforementioned police reports for illegal activity subject you to daily penalties of \$1000 should you not act immediately to abate the activity; and
- > Pursuant to the Oakland Master Fee Schedule B-10 you are hereby assessed a \$3,500.00 Nuisance Case fee.

Please be advised that thirty (30) days from the date of this letter, the City may impose daily penalty assessments of \$1000.00 a day up to \$365,000 a year (pursuant to OMC Chapter 1, Section 1.08 et seq), unless the nuisance conditions are abated. Assessments will be made every 30 days until you have identified remedial measures taken to prevent recurrence of activity to the satisfaction of the City. Further, buildings and structures or portions thereof which are determined to be a public nuisance, shall be abated by repair, rehabilitation, demolition or removal. It is your obligation to abate the nuisance condition.

Assessment will be based on number and frequency of recurrent nuisance conditions, as well as diligence of property owner in addressing concerns of the City. Fees, costs, payments, assessments, and penalties associated with our enforcement actions are significant and shall be a charge against the property and the owners and, if not reimbursed immediately, shall become a special assessment/priority lien recorded against the property title and are recoverable through the property tax general levy and court action, among other remedies available to the City. Failure to remedy or abate nuisance conditions may result in the City doing so and billing you for the costs.

Remedial Actions Required

Pursuant to the above findings and declarations, you are ordered to take all remedial measures necessary to abate nuisance activity identified above. These measures include but are not limited to:

- Within 14 days (from the date of this notification), pay all City assessments to date; and
- > Continually maintain the premises free of blighted conditions; and
- Install security cameras whose footage OPD can access and obtain a Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) analysis by OPD; and
- > Immediately cease and desist the nuisance activity including, but not limited to:
 - Possession of controlled substances for personal use/sale/or distribution; and
 - Possession of any and all drug paraphernalia from the premises for personal use/sale/or distribution; and
 - Loitering on/near, or in the surrounding or rear area of your property.

You have fourteen days in which to implement remedial measures.

APPEAL

As prescribed in OMC section 1.08 you have the right to appeal this determination. Pursuant to OMC section 15.08.410 your appeal must be received within 14 days from the date of this notice. An appeal hearing, if required will be conducted before an independent administrative hearing examiner. In order to request an appeal you must pay a \$67.50 non-refundable filing fee, and submit in writing the details upon which you

base your claim that the City has erred or abused its discretion in these actions. Please be advised that you may be assessed fees for the actual costs incurred by the City for enforcement proceedings against your property.

Should you have questions concerning this form or the appeal process or penalty procedures, please contact the Nuisance Abatement Division's Administrative Assistant weekdays from 9:30 to 11:00 am and 2:30 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. by telephone. Your written appeal must be filed directly with the Administrative Assistant, either in person or via first class mail:

The form for filing an appeal is enclosed. Please be advised that if your written appeal and filing fee is not received before 4:00 p.m. (local time), Tuesday, November 25, 2014, you waive your right for further administrative adjudication of this matter, and your only other method for redressing this matter may be judicial action. Please note that incomplete appeals including, but not limited to, oral notification of your intention to appeal, a written appeal postmarked but not received within the time prescribed, or a written appeal received by the filing deadline without a filing fee, are not acceptable and will be rejected.

OPTION TO MEET FOR COMPLIANCE PLAN

Depending on the nature of the violations, you may also request to meet with the Nuisance Abatement Division and the referring department to develop a compliance plan to abate the nuisance. In some cases, a performance bond will be required along with compliance plan. If you reach an agreement, the City may suspend the daily penalties while you meet the terms of the compliance plan. INTOXICATION

STATE LAW AND COMMON SENSE PROHIBIT PREMISES FROM SERVING ALCOHOL TO A PERSON WHO IS VISIBLY INTOXICATED, OR PERMITTING SOMEONE ELSE TO SERVE THE INTOXICATED PERSON. SPEECH SLURRED, THICK, CONFUSED, ABUSIVE, PROFANE, ANTAGONISTIC OR INCOHERENT APPEARANCE IN DISARRAY, CLOTHING STAINED BALANCE UNSTEADY, OR BODY SWAYING, USING A WALL OR FURNITURE AS A PROP, FACE PALE OR FLUSHED EYES BLOODSHOT, RED, OR PUFFY FUMBLING OR DROPPING OF GLASS, ID, CASH, ETC., OR MISJUDGING DISTANCE UNUSUAL PHYSIOLOGICAL SYMPTOMS, E.G., VOMITING, EXCESSIVE HICCUPPING, LOSING FOCUS, SLEEPY OR FAINTING\

ALL EMPLOYEES WILL MAINTAIN CONTINUAL AWARENESS OF THE LEVEL OF

INTOXICATION OF PATRONS, AS WELL AS WHETHER INDIVIDUALS ARE BUYING

DRINKS FOR OTHERS WHO MAY HAVE IN FACT BEEN CUT OFF.

PROMOTERS

BELLA WILL ONLY WORK WITH PROMOTERS WHO ARE PROFESSIONAL.

PROMOTERS WILL BE REQUIRED TO PROVIDE FULL CONTACT INFORMATION FOR THEMSELVES AND ANYONE THEY HIRE TO WORK AT THE PREMISE. IF THE PROMOTER IS INSURED, BELLA WILL BE LISTED AS ADDITIONALLY INSURED ON ALL RELEVANT POLICIES.

MANAGEMENT WILL REQUIRE THAT ALL PROMOTIONAL MATERIALS BE

APPROVED BY BELLA PRIOR TO BEING PUBLISHED OR RELEASED TO THE

PUBLIC.

MANAGEMENT WILL MAKE ABSOLUTELY CLEAR TO PROMOTERS WHAT THEIR

POLICIES ARE, ESPECIALLY REGARDING NON ADMISSION OF THOSE UNDER 21 YEARS OLD, AND MAKE CLEAR THAT PROMOTERS ARE EXPECTED TO FULLY ADHERE TO THESE POLICIES.

MANAGEMENT WILL HAVE REPRESENTATION AT THE DOOR TO ENSURE THAT

PROMOTERS AND THEIR EMPLOYEES ADHERE TO ALL DOOR POLICIES.

MANAGEMENT WILL RESERVE THE RIGHT TO REFUSE ENTRANCE TO ANY GUEST PURSUANT TO THEIR EXISTING ADMISSION POLICIES.

ALL GUESTS OF THE PROMOTIONAL TEAM MUST BE TREATED AS ANY OTHER

A SIGN WILL BE AFIXXED TO THE OUTSIDE OF THE PERMISE WITH A PHONE NUMBER TO CALL FOR THE COMMUNITY TO REGISTER COMPLAINTS DURING HOURS OF OPERATION AND SPEAK WITH THE MANAGER REGARDING NUISCANCE ACTIVITY.
