Finalization of the Lease Disposition and Development Agreement (LDDA) Third Amendment and the West Gateway Lease for the Army Base Redevelopment Program

Dear Mr. Tagami:

This letter provides clarification of the City's position with respect to the LDDA Third Amendment between CCIG Oakland Global and Prologis and the West Gateway Lease. Although we have reached agreement on the major provisions that were at issue, I believe it is important to provide a clear position of where the City and CCIG find themselves with regard to the potential transport and handling of coal at the proposed bulk commodities terminal at the West Gateway.

Specifically, the finalization of the LDDA Third Amendment and the West Gateway Lease does not in any way limit the City's ability to seek appropriate remedies as a follow up to the City Council's September 21, 2015 informational public hearing regarding the potential transport, transloading and export of coal at the West Gateway bulk commodities terminal. Numerous public comments were received through the public comment period, which ended on October 6, 2015. City staff has recently recommended that the City undertake additional evaluation by subject matter experts of the written and oral testimony and other evidence that has been submitted. Further, this work is proposed to include analysis of the other potential commodities that are proposed to be transported, including fuel oil and gasoline. After the proposed work program is completed, staff will provide additional information and potential approaches to the City Council regarding the Council's direction to develop and evaluate potential actions that the City could employ to address the health and/or safety impacts of the transloading, transportation, handling, and export of coal, fuel oil and gasoline as part of the Project, pursuant to Development Agreement (DA) Section 3.4.2.

Separately and independently, the City is also evaluating discretionary decisions it may take in the future with respect to the bulk commodities terminal (e.g., additional permit requirements) and the scope of additional environmental review, if any, that it may require in connection with any such decision(s), consistent with its existing contractual obligations. Please note that nothing in the LDDA Third Amendment and the West Gateway Lease documents shall be construed to limit the City's ability to address these issues/concerns.

Thank you for your letter of February 11, 2016. We join with the City in celebrating this important milestone in the ongoing progress in realizing our collective vision for the Oakland Global Trade and Logistics Center (Oakland Global) at the former Oakland Army Base. This is the most significant step to date in making a reality the 2,800 project construction jobs, 2,000 permanent waterfront jobs, and an estimated 4,225 regional jobs as well as the \$300 million in annual regional employment income. Both during construction and when operational, Oakland Global is and will be a state-of-the-art integrated multi-modal facility, setting new standards for economic vitality, job creation, and environmentally sensitive and sound operations.

We write to concur in your letter's statement that the relationship between the project developers and the City remains governed by the terms of the LDDA, as amended, and the Development Agreement (DA) for Oakland Global, including the covenants of quiet enjoyment, good faith, and fair dealing implied by California law. Of course, the terms of those vesting documents speak for themselves and define the respective rights and obligations of all parties to them. We have appreciated the clarity with which the terms of the LDDA and DA have guided and structured progress on the project to date and look forward to the same moving forward.

As to future discretionary approvals and related environmental review, again, the law is clear as to both. To date, the full entitlement and initial construction of Oakland Global has fully and completely complied with all applicable laws and regulations, including the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). Whatever future approvals and the related discretion, or lack thereof, associated with them will, of course, be as proscribed by law.

As for the possibility of any given commodity being transported through the West Gateway, there continues to be no commitment to specifically include or exclude any given commodity. We understand that the City is in the midst of reviewing submittals regarding one commodity in particular and, according to your letter, may expand that to others. While any such analysis strikes us as premature given the state of the project and present lack of confirmation regarding commodities, we would encourage the City to confirm which of such commodities are already being transported in and through the City. The degree to which such transport is already occurring certainly speaks to the City's existing views of the health and safety considerations today. As we have said repeatedly as to the future, no commodity will be processed at Oakland Global unless it can be done in accord with all applicable health and safety mandates in law.

Again, we join with the City in recognizing and celebrating this important occasion for Oakland Global, our West Oakland neighbors, and the City at large. We look forward to the ongoing progress and success of the project to the great benefit of all Oaklanders.
