1. SITUATION

Memorial Day Weekend: 28-31 May

The Memorial Day weekend presents late-night cruising activity, referred to as the "Sideshow." The reckless driving and exhibitions of speed that typify these events continue to generate complaints to the Police Department. The incidents also result in collisions, often with serious injury or fatality. Approximately 70% of the cars towed are taken from unlicensed drivers and 25% of the arrests are for driving under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs.

At a minimum, problems associated with the Sideshow include noise, litter, and the defacement of city streets and off-street parking areas from black tire skid marks. Neighborhood residents also complain of disorderly conduct, vandalism, public intoxication, and public urination. Stolen vehicles, firearms, and illegal drugs are routinely recovered and vehicle pursuits of serious offenders do occur. Since 1988, seven traffic fatalities have been linked to the illegal exhibitions of speed and racing that occur during the Sideshow.

Carijama Festival: Memorial Day, 31 May

On 31 May, the Carijama Festival will be held at City Hall Plaza. The event will start at 1200 hours with a parade beginning at 14th St. and Broadway. The festival will include live, amplified entertainment, food booths and craft vendors. No alcoholic beverages will be sold or allowed on the streets. A "Carijama After Party" has been advertised for 1928 Telegraph from 2000-0100 hours.

While the event itself has been the scene of problems in the past, there have also been numerous assaults, acts of vandalism, traffic complaints, reckless driving, crowd control problems, and vehicle collisions in the area at the event's conclusion. Anticipated problems include:

- ◆ Traffic disruption on City streets and arterial freeways
- ◆ Interference with lawful business
- ◆ Assaults and vandalism
- ◆ Crowd management/civil disorder
- ◆ Reckless and drunken driving
- ◆ Public intoxication

2. MISSION

- ◆ To maintain order and preserve public safety for residents and event attendees
- ◆ To ensure that ingress/egress to the area remains functional with minimal disruption
- ◆ To apply the appropriate level of direction and control to protect life, property, and vital facilities
- ◆ To focus law enforcement efforts on criminal behavior known to be most problematic on holiday weekends.

3. EXECUTION

Special Operations

Primary enforcement shall take place in PSAs I, IV, V, and VI. Duties will include:

- ◆ Crowd management
- ◆ Traffic management and enforcement
- ◆ Area control/security
- ◆ Surveillance/video
- ◆ Prisoner transport and mobile booking

Tactical (Tango Teams)

Tango Team Leaders shall be tasked with assembling sufficient chemical agents and less-lethal impact munitions to address riotous, violent behavior. Tango Team members shall be the only personnel authorized to deploy chemical agents or less-lethal impact munitions. Use of specialty impact munitions shall not be indiscriminant nor used to disperse a peaceful crowd. Absent exigent circumstances, such deployment shall occur only at the direction of the Incident Commander.

Video (Victor Teams)

A Victor Team shall be deployed to areas of unlawful activity. Video teams tasks:

- ◆ Record temperament and actions of participants prior to and during crowd formation
- ◆ Monitor radio traffic and respond to areas of potential and actual crowd management situations.
- ◆ Provide descriptive and specific narration of activity being filmed, e.g. “rocks and bottles are being thrown by...” or “the male in the center wearing... just threw a projectile”. Also, provide voiceover of time, location, direction of view, etc.

Area Control (ACT)

The Area Control Teams shall be responsible for festival security and traffic control. Members of the team will be deployed to designated intersections/areas.

Arrest Procedures

Arrests shall comply with Departmental policies and procedures. Prisoners shall be separated in accordance with Department policy.

Tows and Staging

On Friday and Saturday nights, tows will be moved to the old Eastmont substation and the DUI checkpoint location. Officers shall be mindful both of the ages of the vehicles' occupants and the area of the tow and to consider relocating them to a safer area, e.g. the Substation. Additionally, officers shall explain to people why their vehicle is being towed and what steps they need to take to get it back.

Officers shall complete boxes 1-32 on the OPD tow report before having the vehicle relocated for inventory and tow. Special attention should be given to recording the following information:

- Tow authority
- Hold information
- Driver's name
- Section cited (driver)
- Officer's name and S/N

Officers shall tow a vehicle when appropriate and place 30-day holds on vehicles when such authority is granted. Stop data collection forms shall be completed.

Patrol Wagon

Patrol Wagon Officers shall transport arrestees to the Jail and maintain an arrest log. All prisoners transported by officers shall be reported to a wagon for incorporation in the master log. The log should note the transporting unit. Copies of the logs shall be submitted to the Incident Commander at the end of the operation.

Undercover Assignments

Undercover officers shall be deployed in connection with this operation. Undercover officers will be wearing conspicuous article of clothing and will be introduced at lineup. Undercover officers' tasks:

- ◆ Crowd and vehicle videotaping.
- ◆ Communicating critical information, including the location of disruptive vehicles and crowds, to the CP via radio or cell phone.
- ◆ Absent imminent danger, undercover personnel shall not take law enforcement action.

4. SERVICE SUPPORT

Air Support (ARGUS)

ARGUS will be operational on 28, 29, and 31 May.

OTW forms shall be submitted to respective supervisors at the end of the shift.

Reporting/Evidence Collection

- ◆ In the event a major crowd disturbance occurs, each member assigned to this operation shall complete a Supplemental Report documenting his/her activities/observations during the course of the operation.
- ◆ If necessary, dedicated criminal investigators/officers will be assigned to prepare the appropriate Offense Report(s) for all required reports shall be assigned.
- ◆ Ensure a copy of each report is forwarded to the Incident Commander.
- ◆ Notify the Incident Commander, as soon as is practical, of the arrest of any notable personalities.
- ◆ Ensure that, in the event of a criminal act, an arrest, or any deployment of gas or specialty impact munitions, all involved personnel and their immediate supervisor(s) complete the appropriate report (i.e. Crime Report, Supplemental Report, Use of Force Report). Officers shall document specific acts of the individuals, list witnesses, and take witness statements when appropriate.
- ◆ The recovery of physical evidence shall be the responsibility of every member. Supervisors shall ensure that personnel in their respective teams collect, document, and package relevant physical evidence.

5. COMMAND AND COMMUNICATIONS

Command Post

The Command Post shall be established at the Communications Division on 28, 29, and 31 May.

Communications

Primary communications shall utilize the OPD radio system. Portable radios shall be signed out from and returned to the OPD Property Section. Cellular telephones may be used for secondary communications in the event of a system failure or problematic communication conditions.

Media

All media inquiries shall be referred to the Incident Commander. Operational information shall not be discussed with the media.

6. ADMINISTRATIVE INSTRUCTIONS

- ◆ **Uniform (Major Response/Mobile Field Force):** Class C (BDU) with helmet, gas mask, and long baton.
- ◆ **Uniform (Patrol Lineups):** Class B (wool) with helmet, gas mask, and long baton.

ANNEX A: Use of Force

Departmental General Order K-3 applies. The deployment of chemical agents and less-lethal munitions shall be at the direction of the Incident Commander. If an Unlawful Assembly (409 PC) is declared in a dispersal order and persons refuse to leave, second warning(s), if feasible, shall be made prior to the use of chemical agents or less-lethal munitions, allowing persons another opportunity to leave voluntarily.

ANNEX B: Pursuits

Departmental General Order J-4 applies. Supervisors are responsible for authorizing, monitoring, and reporting pursuits involving personnel assigned to them. All involved officers shall switch to the main channel.

1. SITUATION

Memorial Day Weekend: 28-31 May

The Memorial Day weekend presents late-night cruising activity, referred to as the “Sideshow.” The reckless driving and exhibitions of speed that typify these events continue to generate complaints to the Police Department. The incidents also result in collisions, often with serious injury or fatality. Approximately 70% of the cars towed are taken from unlicensed drivers and 25% of the arrests are for driving under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs.

At a minimum, problems associated with the Sideshow include noise, litter, and the defacement of city streets and off-street parking areas from black tire skid marks. Neighborhood residents also complain of disorderly conduct, vandalism, public intoxication, and public urination. Stolen vehicles, firearms, and illegal drugs are routinely recovered and vehicle pursuits of serious offenders do occur. Since 1988, seven traffic fatalities have been linked to the illegal exhibitions of speed and racing that occur during the Sideshow.

Carijama Festival: Memorial Day, 31 May

On 31 May, the Carijama Festival will be held at City Hall Plaza. The event will start at 1200 hours with a parade beginning at 14th St. and Broadway. The festival will include live, amplified entertainment, food booths and craft vendors. No alcoholic beverages will be sold or allowed on the streets. A “Carijama After Party” has been advertised for 1928 Telegraph from 2000-0100 hours.

While the event itself has been the scene of problems in the past, there have also been numerous assaults, acts of vandalism, traffic complaints, reckless driving, crowd control problems, and vehicle collisions in the area at the event’s conclusion. Anticipated problems include:

- ◆ Traffic disruption on City streets and arterial freeways
- ◆ Interference with lawful business
- ◆ Assaults and vandalism
- ◆ Crowd management/civil disorder
- ◆ Reckless and drunken driving
- ◆ Public intoxication

2. MISSION

- ◆ To maintain order and preserve public safety for residents and event attendees
- ◆ To ensure that ingress/egress to the area remains functional with minimal disruption
- ◆ To apply the appropriate level of direction and control to protect life, property, and vital facilities
- ◆ To focus law enforcement efforts on criminal behavior known to be most problematic on holiday weekends.

3. EXECUTION

Special Operations

Primary enforcement shall take place in PSAs I, IV, V, and VI. Duties will include:

- ◆ Crowd management
- ◆ Traffic management and enforcement
- ◆ Area control/security
- ◆ Surveillance/video
- ◆ Prisoner transport and mobile booking

Tactical (Tango Teams)

Tango Team Leaders shall be tasked with assembling sufficient chemical agents and less-lethal impact munitions to address riotous, violent behavior. Tango Team members shall be the only personnel authorized to deploy chemical agents or less-lethal impact munitions. Use of specialty impact munitions shall not be indiscriminant nor used to disperse a peaceful crowd. Absent exigent circumstances, such deployment shall occur only at the direction of the Incident Commander.

Video (Victor Teams)

A Victor Team shall be deployed to areas of unlawful activity. Video teams tasks:

- ◆ Record temperament and actions of participants prior to and during crowd formation
- ◆ Monitor radio traffic and respond to areas of potential and actual crowd management situations.
- ◆ Provide descriptive and specific narration of activity being filmed, e.g. “rocks and bottles are being thrown by...” or “the male in the center wearing... just threw a projectile”. Also, provide voiceover of time, location, direction of view, etc.

Area Control (ACT)

The Area Control Teams shall be responsible for festival security and traffic control. Members of the team will be deployed to designated intersections/areas.

Arrest Procedures

Arrests shall comply with Departmental policies and procedures. Prisoners shall be separated in accordance with Department policy.

Tows and Staging

On Friday and Saturday nights, tows will be moved to the old Eastmont substation and the DUI checkpoint location. Officers shall be mindful both of the ages of the vehicles' occupants and the area of the tow and to consider relocating them to a safer area, e.g. the Substation. Additionally, officers shall explain to people why their vehicle is being towed and what steps they need to take to get it back.

Officers shall complete boxes 1-32 on the OPD tow report before having the vehicle relocated for inventory and tow. Special attention should be given to recording the following information:

- Tow authority
- Hold information
- Driver's name
- Section cited (driver)
- Officer's name and S/N

Officers shall tow a vehicle when appropriate and place 30-day holds on vehicles when such authority is granted. Stop data collection forms shall be completed.

Patrol Wagon

Patrol Wagon Officers shall transport arrestees to the Jail and maintain an arrest log. All prisoners transported by officers shall be reported to a wagon for incorporation in the master log. The log should note the transporting unit. Copies of the logs shall be submitted to the Incident Commander at the end of the operation.

Undercover Assignments

Undercover officers shall be deployed in connection with this operation. Undercover officers will be wearing conspicuous article of clothing and will be introduced at lineup. Undercover officers' tasks:

- ◆ Crowd and vehicle videotaping.
- ◆ Communicating critical information, including the location of disruptive vehicles and crowds, to the CP via radio or cell phone.
- ◆ Absent imminent danger, undercover personnel shall not take law enforcement action.

4. SERVICE SUPPORT

Air Support (ARGUS)

ARGUS will be operational on 28, 29, and 31 May.

Media

All media inquiries shall be referred to the Incident Commander. Operational information shall not be discussed with the media.

6. ADMINISTRATIVE INSTRUCTIONS

- ◆ **Uniform (Major Response/Mobile Field Force):** Class C (BDU) with helmet, gas mask, and long baton.
- ◆ **Uniform (Patrol Lineups):** Class B (wool) with helmet, gas mask, and long baton.

ANNEX A: Use of Force

Departmental General Order K-3 applies. The deployment of chemical agents and less-lethal munitions shall be at the direction of the Incident Commander. If an Unlawful Assembly (409 PC) is declared in a dispersal order and persons refuse to leave, second warning(s), if feasible, shall be made prior to the use of chemical agents or less-lethal munitions, allowing persons another opportunity to leave voluntarily.

ANNEX B: Pursuits

Departmental General Order J-4 applies. Supervisors are responsible for authorizing, monitoring, and reporting pursuits involving personnel assigned to them. All involved officers shall switch to the main channel.



You recently submitted an encroachment application for an event to be held on Memorial Day, Monday, May 31, 2004 in Mosswood Park. Your permit has been reviewed and denied for the following reason:

Per Oakland Municipal Codes 9.52.090 Grounds for Denial of Permit Applications:


- Subsection (e): The granting of the permit will result in substantial adverse impact upon the public health, safety and/or order.
- Subsection (f): The granting of the permit will result in substantial adverse impacts (including, but not limited to, noise, litter, and traffic congestion) upon the surrounding neighborhood or community in general.
- Subsection (o): The granting of the permit is likely to result in substantial negative impacts upon delivery of city-wide police services and therefore pose a threat to the public health, safety and order due to the likelihood of the event resulting in a call for police emergency response.

Due to the increased disruptions during and after the event, which have adversely effected patrons, the surrounding community and the Oakland Police Department in the previous three (3) years, it is our opinion that this event should be moved to an alternative location and date so as not to impact the community as it has in the past.


We have made suggestions about alternative locations that you have refused to consider. Defermery Park is not a suitable alternative and will create similar problems because of the density of the residential community surrounding the park.

You have the right to request reconsideration of this denial. Reconsideration request must be submitted in writing to the Chief of Police within five (5) days upon receipt of this letter. Requests for reconsideration shall state any and all reasons why you believe the denial should be overturned. Within five (5) days of receipt of the request, the Chief of Police shall send written notice of his/her decision and or notice of hearing to the applicant.



At approx. 1835 hrs, I was supporting a skirmish line that was moving on foot N/B Broadway in the 1400 block (see separate Unlawful Assembly Report by LT Kozicki). I saw a large group of approx. 250 persons gathered in the streets and on the sidewalk at the corner of Broadway/15th St. and I heard LT Kozicki issue a dispersal order to this crowd. I also saw approx. 75 people gathered IFO the Wendy's restaurant at the N/E corner of Broadway/15th St. From a distance of approx. 50 yards I saw a flurry of crowd activity directly IFO the Wendy's windows on the west side of the restaurant. Persons within this crowd were moving around rapidly and several people were flailing their arms. Based on my experience I recognized this activity as being consistent with a fight occurring within the crowd. I then saw and hear the window glass of Wendy's west side windows shatter. I suspected that someone had pushed through this window, possibly causing serious bodily injury.

Immediately after my observations listed in the previous paragraph, at 1838 hrs, I hear LT Kozicki come on the radio net and direct Tango Teams to deploy gas toward the crowd. I saw Officers Holmgren and Ross each deploy one gas grenade toward the N/E corner of Broadway/15th St. (see their supplemental reports). I used the 37mm gas gun to deploy one Skat-Shell(CS) by skip firing the munition toward the N/E corner of Broadway/15th St. I saw crowd outside Wendy's run N/B Broadway and E/B 15th St. I saw the people who had been inside Wendy's run out of the restaurant and also run N/B Broadway and E/B 15th St. At the same time myself, Ross, and Holmgren deployed gas, Officers Romans and Doolittle also deployed gas from the west side of Broadway/15th St. See their supplemental reports for details.

SGT Reilly and I entered Wendy's to check on the welfare of any persons who might be remaining inside. I found no one in the restaurant. Officer Romans and I discovered a FB (Williams - V1) lying on the

south sidewalk of 15th St. approx. 25 yards east of Broadway. She was bleeding in the area of her hands, wrists, and arms. We took her to the S/E corner of Broadway/15th St. to await medical treatment from AMR. We transferred Williams to the custody of Officer Hazelwood.

Officer Hazelwood interviewed Williams, who gave the following information: On 31 May 04 after 1530 hrs, she and a girl named Shamika (V2) became involved in a fight IFO Wendy's. Then she and Shamika were pushed through the window at Wendy's. Williams refused medical attention. Officer Hazelwood took Williams' statement. Shamika could not be found for comment.

Officer Donelan interviewed the manager of Wendy's, Herrera (W1), who gave the following information: On 31 May 04 at about 1830 hrs, Wendy's was full of customers. He was behind the soda fountain and observed cars racing outside on the street. He heard the restaurant's window crack and break. Some people ran out the window while others stormed the restaurant's counter and ran into the office. Herrera and his staff left out the back door of the restaurant. Officer Donelan took Herrera's statement.

My investigation revealed that on 31 May 04 at approx. 1838 hrs, Williams was pushed by unknown suspects through the glass window of the Wendy's restaurant, located at the N/E corner of Broadway/15th St., causing serious bodily to Williams.

SUMMARY:

On 31 May 04 I was assigned to the Carajama Festival at Frank Ogawa Plaza. I was the team leader for the less lethal team, "Tango Team".

At approx. 1750 hours, I observed a disturbance in the crowd. A large portion of the crowd began to move from north of 14th St, west of Broadway, across Broadway to the east. The crowd lingered in the middle of the street and I was then able to see a group of Muslim security officers chasing a MB in a white t-shirt. The Muslim security guards were punching the MB who was punching them back. This action served to agitate the crowd, which was under control up to this point.

At approx. 1800 hours I was with the team near the S/W corner of 14th St and Broadway. There were over 1000 people still in the plaza and surrounding sidewalks when I heard a gunshot come from the west near City Hall. A large group of people began to flee the area.

At approx. 1802 hrs., Lt. Kozicki ordered officers to form a skirmish line at 14th St and Broadway. Lt. Kozicki then gave a series of dispersal orders declaring that the crowd was participating in an unlawful assembly. My team was divided with Officers Alexander, Holmgren, Beaver and Ross with me and Officers Doolittle and Brandwood with Officer Romans.

On Lt. Kozicki's order, officers began to move toward the crowd telling people to leave the park. Officers were able to clear the north and south side of 14th St, west of Broadway to the east corner of City Hall.

While officers were engaged in this movement, several hundred people proceeded W/B 14th St to Clay. I noticed that a crowd of over two hundred people had gathered on the N/S of the intersection of 14th St and Clay. At approx. 1820 hours we proceeded to the intersection with members of my team as well as several other officers.

At the intersection I observed that the group had surrounded an older Mercedes Benz which was facing S/B in the number one lane. A rear passenger door was open and a FB with braided hair was being beaten near the rear of the car. Fearing that the FB had been pulled from her car and was being seriously injured, I felt that a rescue was warranted. I did not believe that officers could safely approach the crowd as we were grossly outnumbered having only 12 to 15 officers available. I could not deploy any impact munitions as there was no clear shot on any of the combatants. I elected to deploy chemical munitions and ordered Officer Holmgren to deploy a #15 Rubber Ball CS grenade. Officer Holmgren deployed the grenade over the Mercedes and into the crowd. The crowd immediately dispersed and no further force was required.

The FB fled with the crowd and two MB's entered the Mercedes. I approached the driver, a MB with dreadlocks, and asked that he pull forward across 14th St and wait with officers until the area was more secure. The driver turned W/B on 14th St and began to leave the area. Lt. Kozicki pulled over the Mercedes and also

contacted the driver. He advised that the crowd was stealing chicken from his vehicle. He refused to ID himself or cooperate in any investigation. See Supplemental by Lt. Kozicki.

Our skirmish line continued to proceed W/B on 14th St. when at 1828 hours, officers encountered a small group of people on the S/S of 14th St IFO the Federal Building. Among the people was a FB with a large lump on her forehead. I recognized this FB as being the victim behind the Mercedes. I spoke to her and her acquaintances and she confirmed that she was involved in a fight at 14th and Clay. I offered the FB an ambulance and asked that she stay so that we may provide her with aide. The FB and her friends declined and walked away W/B.

Elements of my team left the area and joined a skirmish line at 14th St and Broadway. The skirmish line proceeded north on Broadway and stopped some thirty to fifty yards south of 15th St. In the intersection of 15th St and Broadway was a crowd of over five-hundred people which was congregating heaviest on the N/E corner. At approx. 1838 hours, one of the Wendy's front windows, which faces Broadway, was shattered. I observed people running in and out of the broken window. It appeared that a member of the crowd had broken the window and was being looted the restaurant. Lt. Kozicki ordered my team to deploy chemical munitions on the crowd.

Officer Holmgren deployed two (2) #15 Rubber Ball CS grenades and Officer Alexander deployed one (1) 37mm Skat-Shell (CS gas) from the 1400 block of Broadway. From the W/S of Broadway Officers Romans and Ross deployed three (3) # 15 Rubber Ball CS grenades (Two from Officer Romans and one from Officer Ross), with Officer Doolittle firing one (1) 37mm Skat-Shell (CS gas). The crowd immediately dispersed from in front of the Wendys as well as inside.

Officer Alexander and I entered the Wendy's to check for injured persons and found the restaurant empty. I exited and called for OFD to respond to the restaurant as the fryers in the kitchen were on. I encountered two to three people on the sidewalk and offered each medical attention directing them to the south were Lt. Kozicki had called for ambulances. My offer was not accepted.

I later inspected the restaurant and found that one (1) #15 Rubber Ball CS grenade had landed inside the dining room some 10 to 12 feet from the broken window. Officers did not intentionally deploy the grenade inside the restaurant. It is likely that the grenade bounced through the broken window after being thrown by an officer on the W/S of Broadway.

My team then performed traffic control duties along Broadway.

I observed approx. 200 people on Clay St north of 14th St. I observed a older model tan Mercedes just north of 14th St and Clay St facing S/B in the crowd. A fight between two females started on the west side of the Mercedes. One of the girls was pulled to the rear of the Mercedes and it appeared several people were on top of the girl on the ground. Several people jumped on top of the Mercedes and the girl on the ground was surrounded by approx. 100 people. Sgt. Reilly then directed off Helmgren 8282P

I observed what appeared to be a fight start on the W/side of Wendy's. I saw the crowd push towards Wendy's and the SW window of Wendy's break. It appeared that people were pushed into the window.

I then heard Lt. Kozicki direct the tango team to deploy gas. I observed off Alexander and off. Holmgren deploy gas and most of the crowd run N/B on Broadway.

After the crowd moved N/B on Broadway the tango team moved north to prevent the crowd from gathering.

A PHYSICAL FIGHT STARTED IN THE STREET NORTH OF THE INTERSECTION AT WHICH POINT PEOPLE BEGAN TO SURROUND THE VEHICLE AND JUMP ONTO THE VEHICLE.
